1. Call to Order

3. Update on Support for Step Down Services

Cristen Bates presented on safety net step down services. It was determined that "the middle is missing," the need for services between acute care and outpatient limited. The focus is wanting to be on Residential Step Down and High Intensity Community services for the mental health gap in the continuum. The upcoming projects are focused on outpatient step down and residential step down. The residential step down recommendations are for more than 125 group home beds for clients coming out of the hospital or to avoid going in.

A discussion occurred.

- There was a question about the stakeholder engagement process for the care coordination efforts.
 - Camille Harding, with CDHS, has begun a policy care coordination group, user design/experience group and a health information technology group.

• Regarding the question about stakeholder engagement for in-home respite care, it's unknown what the stakeholder process will look like for this.

- For residential step down, RAE 4 commented that the shortage of group home beds has been a real problem for them.
- A position has been posted by HCPF to work on the ARPA project on Youth Step Down Alternative, both, residential and outpatient programs.
- The residential step down recommendation for more than 125 group home beds are only for adults. However, there are providers in the state under the Families First act and psychiatric residential treatment facilities that are being expanded that may be able to assist. CDHS has expanded the number of residential services for youth by QRTPs and QRTFs by 30 beds. This was done with emergency FEMA funding.
