## 2017 Recommendation Report

The <u>2017 Medicaid Provider Rate Review Recommendation Report</u> was published on November 1, 2017.

The Department made six recommendations:

### Physician Services and Surgeries

- 1. A payment methodology that differentiates rates based on place of service.
- 2. For the services in regions where the Department's access analysis was inconclusive, the Department will continue access analysis and utilization monitoring.
- 3. A budget-neutral rebalancing of certain individual physician service and surgery rates with payments below 80% and above 100% of the benchmark.

## 2017 Recommendation Report

### Anesthesia


- 4. A reduction in anesthesia service rates to 100% of the benchmark.
- Home- and Community-Based Services (HCBS) Waivers
- 5. Increasing the rate for alternative care facility (ACF) services.
- 6. Increasing rates for other waiver services as identified through the ongoing rate setting process, with special attention to services:
  - a. Identified by stakeholders through the rate review process; and
  - b. With the biggest gaps between current rates and rates developed via the new rate setting methodology.

## Year Three Services

## Year Three Approach

- Strengthen consultation by sharing earlier in the process:
  - > analysis results for all services; and
  - Department recommendations.
- Focus on efficiency: fewer, more efficient meetings.
- Focus on access: potentially expanding the Access to Care Index and including other data sources in access analyses for certain services.



## Primary Care and E&M: Service Description

<u>E&M services</u> include basic office visits for medical care.

<u>Vaccines and immunizations</u> (hereinafter simply vaccines) include services that improve immunity to a particular disease.

<u>Family planning services</u> prevent or delay a pregnancy and include services such as contraceptives and sterilization procedures.

<u>Primary Care Alternative Payment Methodology (APM)</u> services in the APM code set are not a category of service, but rather a list of services typically administered in a primary care office.







<u>Maternity Services</u> include regular obstetric care, which includes ante natal, labor and delivery, and post-natal care, as well as other needed obstetrical services.






