Improving health care access and outcomes for the people we serve while demonstrating sound stewardship of financial resources

Introduction to DME

- Includes medical equipment that can withstand repeated use and that generally would be of no value to the member in the absence of a disability, illness or injury.
 - ➤ E.g., wheelchairs, hospital beds, and oxygen concentrators.
 - Prosthetics, orthotics and disposable supplies are scheduled for review in Year Five of the Rate Review process.

Bed & Bedroom Equipment (76)


Oxygen & Respiratory Care (41)

Upper Payment Limit (UPL) & DME

- Federal legislation requires states and the Centers for Medicare and Medicaid Services (CMS) to set certain DME rates at or below 100% of Medicare reimbursement.
- Plan to review the codes subject to UPL in Year Four.
 - > Focus on non-fiscal recommendations

MPRRAC Orientation to House Bill 18-1198

Legislation

HB18-1198 requires that "each statutorily created board or commission in State government..., shall implement written policies or bylaws and obtain annual training on" certain legal requirements, as well as scope, processes, and responsibilities of the committee.

Commencing January 2019
