

Background

Who is HCPF?

- HCPF = Colorado Department of Health Care Policy and Financing
- Designated as Colorado's single state Medicaid agency
- Responsible for supervision and oversight of Colorado's public insurance programs

Who We Serve

February 2023:

1,702,359 Coloradans received Health First Colorado

47,367 enrolled in Child Health Plan *Plus*

Medicaid covers 42% of all Colorado Births



What is Health First Colorado?



- Free or low-cost public health care coverage for Coloradans who qualify
- Comprehensive benefits and services
- Care coordination
- More adults and parents who qualify
- Apply at any time



Lactation Support for Medicaid Members

How did we get here?

- HB22-1289: Health Benefits for Colorado Children and Pregnant Persons or Cover all Coloradans bill.
 - Expands health coverage to children and pregnant persons regardless of immigration status
 - Improves existing Health First Colorado and CHP+ benefits for children and pregnant persons

Lactation Services Expansion

- Single-user electric breast pump coverage:
 - Expanded to include all pregnant and postpartum members as of June 8, 2022
- Multi-user electric breast pump coverage:
 - > Effective January 1, 2023
- Lactation Consultation coverage Coming this Fall!

"AN INDIVIDUAL TRAINED IN ADVANCED LACTATION SUPPORT SHALL PROVIDE THE LACTATION SUPPORT SERVICES."
HB 1289

*The lactation services benefit is in addition to the services sill offered to the Women, Infant, and Children (WIC) program members. Members may continue to get lactation equipment and support services from Health First Colorado and/or WIC.

CHP+ Lactation Support

- This benefit also includes funding for CHP+ members
- CHP+ plans currently cover Lactation Support Services
- Current CHP coverage discussion
 - > 79 pumps were provided to CHP+ members
 - All four CHP+ MCOs offer free services for members with support from Care Management
- Type of certification/licensure for lactation providers


