

10 Simple First Steps toImprove Disability Competent Care

- 1. Use the Disability Competent Care Assessment Tool to see where you stand.
- 2. Hold a staff meeting to view these videos; then follow up with a discussion about your commitment to Disability Competent Care and what simple changes can be made in your practice.
- 3. Check for and remove or fix any physical obstacles to entering your building or office.
- 4. Remove chairs to make space for people using wheelchairs in your reception area.
- 5. Investigate purchasing an adjustable exam table and wheelchair scale.
- 6. Check signage and replace with large, legible signs where needed.
- 7. Work with your RCCO representative to locate a resource for reliable sign language interpreters.
- 8. Create a checklist for schedulers with appropriate questions about needed accommodations, then keep information obtained in the patient's medical record.
- 9. Ask suppliers of Patient Education Materials to send large print versions.
- Encourage all your staff to be fully on board and practice proper etiquette when interacting with people with disabilities
