Helpful Information

Why am I receiving a corrected 1095-B form?

You are receiving a corrected 1095-B form because information on the 1095-B form we sent you before for you or someone else in your home changed or was corrected.

What do I need to do with my corrected 1095-B form(s)?

Keep your corrected IRS Form 1095-B with your other tax documents for your records. Do not return Form 1095-B to your county. If you file taxes, do not attach Form 1095-B

with your tax return.

Who do I contact for help?
