



Behavioral Health Secure Transportation (BHST) Overview



Behavioral Health Secure Transportation (BHST) Goals

- New alternative option for secure transportation throughout levels of behavioral health care
- Administratively simple
- Billed separately from other services, including Mobile Crisis Response (MCR)



BHST Basics

- HB 21-1085 mandates secure transportation for behavioral health crises with payments from Health Care Policy and Financing (HCPF) no later than July 1. 2023.
- HCPF is developed this new benefit for Medicaid members in alignment with mobile crisis response and transportation best practices.
 - HCPF Rule adopted on April 14, 2023
 - Published in <u>CCR 10 CCR 2505-10 8.019</u>
 - Enrollment opened June 1, 2023

Medicaid Transportation Spectrum



Scheduled trips to
non-medical places that
support member health
and community
integration

*eligible to Medicaid waiver members only Scheduled trips to provide continuity of care to members, including planned outpatient or inpatient appointments Urgent transportation to members in behavioral health crisis

Urgent and emergent transportation due to medical emergency to highest level of care



Medicaid Reimbursement

Behavioral Health Secure Transport

Urgent transportation to members in behavioral health crisis

- Aligns with current transportation <u>mileage rates</u>
- No payment differential based on licensure nor vehicle type
- Fee-for-service rates
 - □ A0999 = \$262.66
 - □ A0425 = \$6.10 per mile
- Billed directly to HCPF



BHA Reimbursement Option





BHST Licensing/Permit Matrix

	Type 1 Vehicle means a permitted vehicle with a permanent safety partition that separates the driver from the passenger compartment. 1:1 Staff ratio	Type 2 Vehicle means a permitted, non-partitioned vehicle. 1:1 Staff ratio plus Driver
Class A means secure transportation services licensed to use physical restraint during secure transport	Capacity to restrain in a partitioned vehicle	Capacity to restrain in a non-partitioned vehicle
Class B means secure transportation services that are not licensed to use physical restraint during secure transport.	No capacity to restrain in a partitioned vehicle	No capacity to restrain in a non-partitioned vehicle

Important Enrollment Update

To simplify enrollment issues, Behavioral Health Secure Transportation is now its own provider type. When enrolling, please select ATYPICAL and enrollment type 97 - Behavioral Health Secure Transportation (Specialty Type Secure Transportation 773). Please enroll as a provider via the <u>Provider Portal</u> following the <u>Medicaid Enrollment Process</u>.



BHST Provider Enrollment Requirements

Behavioral Health Secure Transportation Provider Type: 97 Specialty: Secure Transportation Specialty Code: 773 Enrollment Type: Atypical

• Each service location must complete a separate application.

Required Attachments:

- Board of County Commissioners license for secure transportation services for each county of operation.
- Board of County Commissioners vehicle permit for each vehicle.
- W9 (signed and dated within the last 6 months)
- Voided business check (no temporary checks or deposit slips) or bank letter (dated within the last 6 months)
- Malpractice/Liability insurance information must be entered in the application; however, proof of insurance is not a required attachment.

General Requirements:

• Employer Identification Number (EIN); IRS 147C EIN Verification Letter is not a required attachment

Reciprocity Agreements

- BHST provider enrollment requires license & permits. If you are using a reciprocity agreement to operate in another county, we do not need you to include your reciprocity agreement in your enrollment.
 - keep your records up to date on all licenses/permits that allow you to operate in your service area.
 - keep your CDPHE profile up-to-date

 Specialty: Specialty: County Agency
 Specialty Code: 124
- Provider Type/Code: 13 Transportation (Emergency Medical Transportation) Specialty: Emergency Specialty Code: 324



NEMT Provider Enrollment

- Provider Type 73 <u>Non-Emergent Medical</u> <u>Transportation</u>
 - BHST requires providers have CPR and First Aid
 - NEMT requires providers have BLS
- HCPF <u>Provider Enrollment</u>
 - Allow up to one month for processing

Local Collaboration

Once BHST providers have obtained appropriate licenses and permits, it is recommended that BHST providers advise local agencies of their operations. Some suggestions for connections include:

- Local dispatch agencies, also known as <u>Public Safety Answering Points (PASP)</u>. It is recommended that you contact the administrative line instead of 911 for routine matters.
- <u>Mobile Crisis Response</u> Teams
- <u>Emergency medical transportation services</u>
- Community behavioral health services
- Facilities
