Regional Accountable Entity (RAE) Administrative Payment Reports Posted

RAE Administrative Payment Reports for the 2020-2021 state fiscal year have been posted for each RAE on the <u>ACC Deliverables webpage</u>. Substance Use Disorder (SUD) Benefit Implementation SUD Provider Network List

In collaboration with our RAE partners, the Department has published a SUD Provider Network List. The list includes all residential and inpatient SUD treatment providers who are contracted with RAEs to provide SUD services. Due to ongoing contracting and credentialing, this list will be updated periodically and made available on the Department's SUD webpage, Ensuring a Full Continuum of SUD Benefits under "IMPORTANT UPDATES." The list is available in two formats:

Maternal Opioid Misuse (MOM) Grant Re-Launches

The Centers for Medicare and Medicaid Services (CMS) developed a Maternal Opioid Misuse (MOM) Model. This model was created to fight the ongoing opioid use disorder among pregnant and postpartum Medicaid clients. Due to COVID-19, the MOM Model was delayed a year and is set to re-launch and offers the following opportunity:

Given the unique needs and existing efforts in communities across Colorado, the Department's approach for the MOM model will support local providers while building statewide capacity to serve pregnant and parenting women with OUD and their infants. The Department will utilize a total budget of \$4.6 million to provide two components of support for integrating care:

- 1. Regionally specific sub-grants totaling up to \$506,778 per site over four years for integrating SUD treatment into primary and obstetric care sites that are appropriate to their community.
- 2. Technical assistance to sub-grantees through a learning collaborative model. Please visit Colorado's MOM Model website for more information and updates on the sub-grantee application process.
