
FINANCING THE BHASOs MODEL

- State and federal funding for community behavioral health services will be funneled through BHASOs to enact the vision of BHA.
- The BHASOs will use these funds to contract with a network of behavioral health providers that will provide services to individuals in their communities.

Colorado LIFTS: Navigate Care

Tier 1: Care Navigation

Brief, temporary support in connecting to services and social supports

Tier 2: Care Coordination

Ongoing, individualized care plan in collaboration with the individual with warm connections to care and follow-up for continued needs

Tier 3: Care Management

Regular, frequent support from a clinical team more robust and intensive individualized service plan driven by the individual

How will BHASOs impact receiving services?

Fewer steps to access care

Fewer steps for individuals and families to get behavioral health care and faster access to care

Streamlined process

Move from a multi-stream model of MSOs, ASOs, and mental health service centers to one source for care.

Care coordination focus

03

Provide behavioral health safety net services and care coordination for a whole-person health journey.



Colorado LIFTS (Linking Individuals and Families to Services) is Colorado's streamlined network of safety net behavioral health services, including crisis, substance use, and mental health support.

LIFTS is coordinated and funded through the Behavioral Health Administrative Service Organizations. On July 1, 2025, the LIFTS website will help people in Colorado connect directly with care navigation services, no matter their insurance status or where in the state they live.
