



Accountable Care Collaborative Program Improvement Advisory Committee Meeting Minutes

April 17, 2024
9:30 A.M. to 12:00 P.M.

1. Welcome, Introductions, & Minutes Approval

Matt Sundeen welcomed members to the Program Improvement Advisory Committee (PIAC) meeting and called the meeting to order at 9:31 A.M.

A quorum of voting members was present.

Kelly Phillips-Henry presented the March meeting minutes for approval. David Keller motioned to approve, Mark Levine seconded. There was one abstention. The March meeting minutes were approved.

2. Health Neighborhood Presentations

Matt Sundeen introduced CCHA, Regional Accountable Entity for regions 6 and 7, and Denver Health Managed Care Organization to provide presentations on current and past health neighborhood work, including efforts to support the continuous coverage unwind.

3. ACC Phase III Evaluation

Kelly Phillips-Henry introduced Tamara Keeney, the Department's Research and Analysis Manager, to review the proposed ACC Phase III evaluation plan and seek feedback from the PIAC.

Matt Sundeen introduced Suman Mathur, CHI, and Mark Quierolo, the Department's Implementation Section Manager, to provide a status update on ACC

Phase III and how stakeholder feedback is being incorporated into the Request for Proposals. The Department will engage the PIAC in future conversations regarding Phase III implementation.

5. eConsult

Kelly Phillips-Henry introduced Matt Lanphier, the Department's Operations & Analytics Unit Supervisor, to share progress and next steps regarding the Department's eConsult platform.

6. Subcommittee Updates

Kelly Phillips-Henry introduced the PIAC subcommittees to provide updates and announcements from their recent meetings.

Daniel Darting, a Behavioral Health Integration Strategies (BHIS) subcommittee co-chair, gave an update that at their last meeting BHIS discussed individuals transitioning from criminal justice settings and timely connection to care, impact of the continuous coverage unwind, and continued presentations from the Regional Accountable Entities on their Behavioral Health Incentive Programs.

David Keller, a Provider and Community Experience (P&CE) subcommittee co-chair, gave an update that P&CE discussed eConsults and the ACC Phase III evaluation. P&CE also discussed topics of interest for future meetings, and suggestions included levels of severity and acuity for the proposed tiered levels of care in ACC Phase III, a deeper dive into the different approaches to health neighborhoods and best practices.

Daphne McCabe, a Performance Measurement and Member Engagement (PMME) subcommittee co-chair, gave an update that PMME discussed member feedback communication loops and suggestions that HCPF start to document how member feedback is used and change that results from feedback received, and MEACs have been very valuable to gather this member feedback. Mark Queirolo also attended to present on ACC Phase III stakeholder feedback. At the next meeting, PMME would like to hear about attribution in ACC Phase III and what a pilot period might look like.

7. Open Comment

Kelly Phillips-Henry opened the meeting for public comment. There were no comments from the public.

8. PIAC Discussion and Next Steps

Matt Sundeen reviewed next steps and action items from the meeting:
