

ACC Phase II Attribution

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What is Attribution?

- *Method used to attribute Health First Colorado members to their medical homes, or Primary Care Medical Providers (PCMPs)*
- *Used to determine a member's RAE assignment*

Utilization

- Predominant claims history with a PCMP over the last 18 months
- Paid Evaluation and Management (E&M) claims are prioritized, then other types of claims are considered.
- For children up to age 21, a set of 10 preventive service codes are prioritized.

Family Connection

- If no claims history with a contracted PCMP, family relationship is used.
- Occur only if the PCMP is appropriate (children will not be attributed to 'Adults Only' locations).

Geographic

- System determines closest appropriate PCMP within the member's region.

Member Choice

- All members are initially attributed using:
 - Utilization,
 - Family connection, or
 - Geographic
- Every ACC member has the option of changing their PCMP at any time by contacting the Health First Colorado enrollment broker.

Panel Limits/Controls

- PCMPs can limit their panel sizes by setting a limit, or by turning off geographic/proximity based attributions.
- PCMPs can limit attributions to specific populations (ie women only, pediatric only).

Reattribution

- Occurs every 6 months for all members
- Children <12 months reattributed monthly
- Children in foster care are not reattributed
