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The Behavioral Health and Integration Strategies Subcommittee assess behavioral health integration within the ACC by investigating the strategies by which Regional Accountable Entities (RAEs) and providers are joining behavioral and physical health at the practice and systems-level, by improving foundational understanding of behavioral health issues, benefits, and services, including substance use disorders, by ensuring care coordination and continuity across benefits, and by identifying the barriers to accessing behavioral health including but not limited to gaps in care and stigma.

Subcommittee Objectives:

1. Department of Corrections (DOC) – Develop recommendations for care coordination and care continuity for behavioral health services during re-entry from corrections-involved members.
2. Crisis service system - Develop recommendations regarding the implementation of the crisis services system and collaboration with RAEs.
3. Other behavioral health concerns – Continuously track and monitor potential behavioral health concerns within the ACC.

Strategy Screens:

1. Members who dually diagnosed with a mental health disease and a developmental disability.
2. Members who are involved in the Foster Care system.
3. Geriatric members.



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
