SUD Benefit/Opportunities

By the Numbers:

- Total members served across continuum >65,000
- Members served in residential facilities continue to increase: >5,000 year 1, >8,000 year 2 anticipating >11,000 year 3
- 35 OTP facilities open across Colorado 100% enrolled with Medicaid
- 61 Residential Facilities enrolled with Medicaid

Objectives of 1115:

- Increase the rate of member engagement in treatment
- Increase retention in treatment
- Decrease overdose deaths
- Decrease ED/Inpatient utilization
- Fewer readmissions to the same or higher level of care
- Improve access for physical health conditions

Midpoint Assessment for 1115 completed:

- Independent reviewer met with state employees, MCE representatives, providers and members who have utilized the benefit
- Report will be publicly posted when accepted by CMS
- Noted areas to improve services in alignment with objectives:
 - >Care coordination between levels of care
 - >ED utilization and integration with continuum
 - >Youth services

21-137 Report Take Aways: <u>SUD UM Report</u>

- 2 years of SUD Residential UM reporting
 - >Medical Necessity Denials remaining under 5%
 - Opportunity to revise length of stay minimums based on initial authorization and continued authorization data
- Independent audit of denials agreed with 100% of final denial determinations

SUD Benefit Growth & Evolution

- Envisioning SUD coverage for Transplant recipients who have an SUD diagnosis
- Exploring partial hospitalization as a covered level of care (2.5)
- ASAM 4 planned release this fall, Colorado's implementation strategy
