2025 CO CCBHC Planning Grant

- CCBHC: Certified Community Behavioral Health Clinics are specially designated organizations designed to ensure access to coordinated, comprehensive behavioral healthcare.
- CCBHC Planning Grant: \$1,000,000 grant fund over 1(one) calendar year
 - > Grant Period: 12/31/2024 12/30/2025
- Opportunity to further support the Colorado Behavioral Health Safety Net System
 - >Joint effort between HCPF and the Behavioral Health Administration (BHA)

1115 Waiver Approval

Colorado's 1115 Demonstration Waiver

HCPF received approval from CMS on amendments #1 and #2 on January 13, 2025.

This approval provides Colorado with the necessary authorities to cover the following services:

- Prerelease services for individuals transitioning from correctional facilities; and
- Reimbursement for acute inpatient and residential stays in institutes for mental disease (IMD) for individuals diagnosed with a serious mental illness (SMI) or serious emotional disturbance (SED).
- Housing services including pre-tenancy and housing navigation services, tenancy sustaining services, rent/temporary housing for up to 6 months (including utilities), and one-time transition and moving costs; and
- Nutrition services including meals or pantry stocking, medically-tailored meals, and nutrition counseling/education.





Metric: Behavioral Health Engagement for Members Releasing from State Prisons


- Part of the Performance Pool incentive funds
- Developed with BHIS to comply with SB19-222
- Definition: Percentage of members releasing from a Department of Corrections (DOC) facility with at least one billed behavioral health capitated service or short-term behavioral health visit within fourteen (14) days.
- Statewide metric
- Six (6) month delay for claims runout

- Initial rate in June 2019 was 9.02%
- The target for FY24-25 is 34.28%
- The current rate through June 2024 is 33.44%




