On Wednesday, January 31, the House Health and Human Services Committee heard one of the Department's priority bills, HB24-1038: High-Acuity Crisis for Children & Youth which is sponsored by Rep. Young, Rep. Bradley. Sen. Kirkmeyer and Sen. Fields. This bill will create a system of care for high acuity youth under the age of 21. The bill passed in committee 9-1 with no amendments and is now headed to the House Appropriations Committee. High Acuity Crisis for Children and Youth: This bill had its first hearing this past week. The next hearing will be in House Appropriations Committee on 2/15. This bill includes the CHRP expansion for Behavioral Health needs.
