# Federal and State Requirements

- Federal:
  - Program requirements (what we *must* cover, exclusions, how drug manufacturers participate, etc.)
- State:
  - Flexibility to decide how to manage benefits within the rules
  - Governed by:
    - Colorado Medicaid State Plan (CMS)
    - Colorado Code of Regulations (Medical Services Board)
    - state statute (state legislature or public vote)

# Early and Periodic Screening, Diagnostic and Treatment (EPSDT)

- A Federal requirement to cover services and treatments that are medically necessary to correct or ameliorate a condition, even if those services are not typically covered for under Colorado Medicaid
- For children aged 20 and under
- Requests completed by providers

# Supporting Families Through the PA/EPSTD Process

- Stay in communication with prescriber (best)
- Pharmacy can verify if PA approval was received
- Health First Colorado Pharmacy helpdesk (Prime)
  - Providers - Assist with processing the PA request
  - Members - Can verify status of PA request
