# CMS Comprehensive Guide Timeline

FY 2023-24 & FY 2025-26 FY 2026-27 FY 2024-25 FY 2022-23 July 1, 2026 **HCPF** works with **HCPF** analyzing May 18, 2023 CMS CMS to approve potential impact to CMS deadline and Issues Guidance changes to PACAP program and effective date for developing and SPA mandatory changes implementation plan

The SHS program will operate according to current rules and regulations in the program manual until changes have been approved by CMS.

# CMS Comprehensive Guide

- Delivering Services in School Based Settings: A Comprehensive Guide to Medicaid Services and Administrative Claiming issued May 18, 2023
- Participants will be notified prior to any program changes
- Review and direct questions to HCPF
- No anticipated changes around direct service billing
- CMS suggested several program enhancements that Colorado already had in place

Changes to be included in State Plan Amendment submission:

- Bus aides not qualifying specialized transportation
- Time study number of moments and length time study



## National Provider Identifier (NPI) Requirement

Physical Therapy (PT), Occupational Therapy (OT), and Speech, Language, and Hearing Services July 1, 2024 or later must have a valid NPI in the ordering, prescribing, and referring (OPR) field

District/BOCES NPI is no longer valid in the OPR field

 Services with invalid OPR NPIs including Medicaid Provider ID will be denied


#### Reminders:

- o 120-day timely filing requirement
- Service documentation is required for providers to be on your direct service staff pool list
- CMS compliance requirement
- These providers are considered unqualified without a Medicaid provider ID and should not be on your staff pool list




# SHS Program Stakeholders

# Who is your Stakeholder?



Other health coverage options include:


- Employer coverage, check with your employer to learn about options, rules and deadlines.

- Coverage through Medicare, for people age 65 or older or people under 65 with certain disabilities.
- Coverage for active or former military, naval, or air service through Tricare (active) or VA (veterans).

FAQs

If you no longer qualify for Health First Colorado or CHP+, you have a limited amount of time to apply for other coverage. The time you have to apply for new coverage, known as a "special enrollment period," changes depending on the coverage provider.

Other health coverage options include:

- Coverage through your employer. Check with your employer to learn about options, rules and deadlines.
- Coverage through a family member's health insurance, such as a spouse, or parent if you are 25 or younger
- Coverage through Connect for Health Colorado (Colorado's official health insurance marketplace). You might qualify for financial assistance to reduce the cost of your premium.

## LSP Reminders

#### LSP Revisions

- Can be initiated at any time during the 5-year plan period
- Must align with community health assessment
- Must include (1) a revised LSP and (2) an LSP companion form

#### LSP Renewals

- CDE recommends ten months to complete a new LSP submission
- If you don't know when your LSP will end, check the CDE SHS website to find your cohort group.

## Parental Consent Forms

Prior to accessing a child's or parent's public benefits for the first time, a public agency must:

- Obtain written parental consent informing parents of what Personally Identifiable Information (PII) may be disclosed, why, and with whom the information will be shared. <u>This is required</u> <u>under the Family Education Rights Privacy Act (FERPA)</u>.
- These parental consent forms concern the disclosure of PII necessary for billing purposes. It is not consent to bill Medicaid.

## Parental Consent Update

Per the United States Department of Education on 12/27/24:

The Secretary is withdrawing a notice of proposed rulemaking, which proposed to amend regulations under Part B of the Individuals with Disabilities Education Act (Part B of IDEA or the Act) that govern the Assistance to States for the Education of Children with Disabilities program, including the Preschool Grants program.

\*\*Next Steps: No changes to district business operations for parental consent forms\*\*

Federal Register:: Assistance to States for the Education of Children With Disabilities; Withdrawal

If under comprehensive review, parental consent forms are due Friday, February 28, 2025.

Reimbursement Spending Reports to CDE:

• Report due: Friday, February 28, 2025

For Local Services Plans ending in June of 2025:

- Initial review draft: Tuesday, June 17, 2025
- Final submission: Tuesday, July 1, 2025
