Colorado Community First Choice (CFC) vs. Adult Home and Community-Based Services (HCBS) Waivers Comparison Chart

The purpose of this document is to demonstrate the difference between Colorado Adult Home and Community-Based Services Waivers (1915c/HCBS) and Community First Choice Option (1915k/CFC), and what future home and community-based services will look like under waivers versus CFC in 2025.

CFC is not finalized with the Centers for Medicare and Medicaid Services (CMS), Colorado Code of Regulations, or Colorado State Statute. This document demonstrates what CFC would currently look like when implemented and is **subject to change.**

Furthermore, the information on HCBS waivers is taken directly from the <u>Adult HCBS Waiver Comparison chart</u> which is updated periodically, and this document will be updated to reflect those changes.

The "What services are available?" section lists services that are planned to move into CFC from the HCBS Waivers and appear in **bold text** under each waiver column. The service titled "Wellness Education Benefit" listed under each waiver indicates a new service that the Department of Health Care Policy and Financing is seeking to put in all waivers in 2025. The CFC column provides the full list of services that are intended to be offered under CFC. Each member will need to have an assessed need to receive the service.
