House Bill 23-1226

- House Bill 23-1226: Hospital Transparency Reporting and Requirements
- Expands upon the legislation of HB19-1001
- Creates additional reporting requirements on annual reporting
- Creates a one-time data submission
- Signed into law last summer, now implementing the req'ments

One-time Reporting Requirements

- Due by July 1, 2024 Hospitals shall submit:
- Summary of financial transfers to/from related parties 2014 2020.
- Physician practice acquisitions and affiliation info 2014 2020.
- Details of <u>significant other revenue</u> that would otherwise be reported in the Medicare Cost Report between FY 2019-20 through FY 2022-23.

One-time Reporting Requirements

- Draft template for submissions coming soon with re-iterated guidance
- Submissions through M&S portal

Annual Reporting

Major changes to be included in the annual reporting:

- Summary of the hospital's financial transfers to/from related parties.
- Hospital-specific statement of cash flows.
- Narrative report of planned & completed projects and capital investments >\$25 million.
- Information on current physician affiliations and acquisitions.
- Changes to no more than 25 service lines.
- Salary and total compensation data of the top five highest paid administrative positions of each hospital.
