February 15th Forecast

- Enrollment has declined by 261,935 members through September (includes 90-day reconsideration period)
- We're projecting that 777,196 people will disenroll by May 2024 (44% of overall redeterminations) and that 257,991 people will enroll or re-enroll over that time period
 - Enrollment increased by 551k members from March 2020 to March 2023 and we're projecting it will decrease by 519k during unwind
 - This means that enrollment will drop to the pre-PHE level before starting to grow again
- We anticipate that the composition of members will closely resemble pre-PHE norms as people who enrolled during the COVID-induced economic downturn a generally healthier population will no longer qualify

Department Updates

- HCPF legislative agenda and priority bills
 - Senate Bill 24-116 revisions to Hospital Discounted Care
 - Sunset Colorado Indigent Care Program (CICP)
 - Revise CHASE statute references from CICP to Disproportionate Share Hospital (DSH) payments
 - Direct DSH policy to hospitals who serve higher numbers of Medicaid enrolled and uninsured patients



HB23-1226: Hospital Transparency and Reporting Requirements

- 1. Rules surrounding Quarterly reporting requirements will be effective March 30
 - a. Quarterly reporting window open for hospital submission
- 2. engaging with stakeholders on revisions to rules surrounding annual and one-time reporting requirements
 - a. such as inclusion of additional financial statements previously not requested, compensation information, and corrective action plans for noncompliance.

HB23-1243: Hospital Community Benefit

- 1. Currently in the process of stakeholder engagement with hospitals, systems, and other stakeholders on rule development
- 2. Rules will be brought to medical service board during April and May
 - a. rules will include changes to: public meeting requirements; best practices for engaging community feedback and accommodation standards; and annual submission requirements to HCPF
- 3. Submissions of annual reporting to begin Sept. 1st
