October Recap: SB 212 Changes

- Effective July 1, 2021
- Eliminated \$6 million line item for CACP clinics
- Directed HCPF to seek federal matching funds for the Primary Care Fund (PCF)
 - Doubles PCF, +\$25 million
 - Approved by CMS in late October 2021



October Recap: HB 1198 Changes

- Effective June 2022
- Implements hospital discounted care
- Not a program but a set of Rules for how hospitals must structure their financial assistance programs
- Applies to same population as CICP
- Requires Dept. to make Rule changes to CICP



HB 1198 Implementation Process

- Policy Development Team (PDT) met 9 times to assist with:
 - Developing forms & policies
 - Drafting Rule
- PDT milestones:
 - 5 stakeholder meetings in Jan/Feb
 - Draft Rule presentation to stakeholders on Mar 1
 - Draft Rule to MSB on Mar 11
 - Public Rule review on Mar 21
 - Final Rule review with MSB on Apr 8



The Council's Challenge

- 1198 and 212 have changed the game
- The Council must arrive at recommendations for the Colorado Indigent Care Program's future
- Our shared goals are to ensure access and quality, while minimizing administrative burden and confusion



Proposed Approach

Meeting 1

- Clarify the challenge and the approach
- Determine key considerations we must address

Meeting 2

- Evaluate each option vs. considerations
- Determine pro/con and iterate toward proposal

Meeting 3

- Invite broader group of stakeholders to participate
- Engage in discussion of benefits and drawbacks

Meeting 4

- Review recommendation draft and refine
- Assign final editors

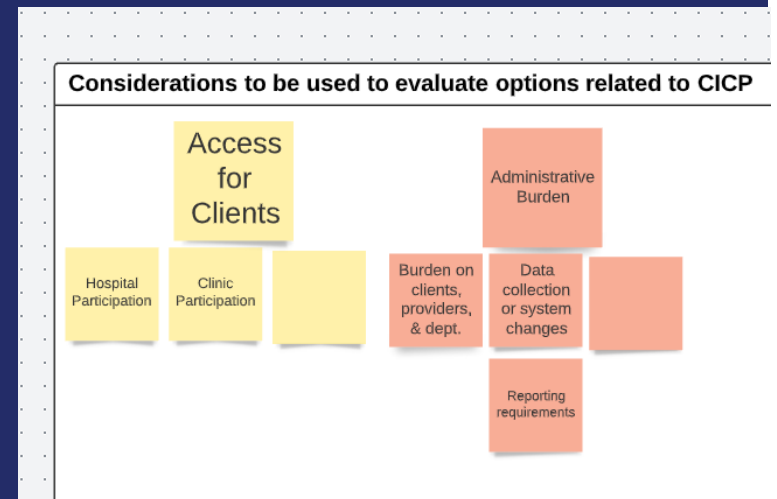
What do we mean by considerations?
