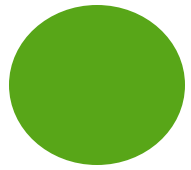

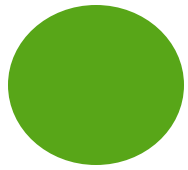

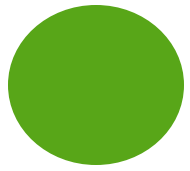


Quality Framework - Status

Next Sprint Group – Claims Data Brainstorm

Q: What is it all about?

A: Finding Intriguing Questions to Ask with the Following Pieces of Data

- Fee for Service Claims data for Medicaid (what service was performed, which provider billed for it, how much did we pay for it)
 - Have cross-over claims for Medicare, but not all Medicare claims (big gap on acute care side)
 - State plan (pharmacy, physician, in- and out-patient, capitation payments)
 - All HCBS waiver services
- Diagnoses
 - Not very good on HCBS claims, much better on acute care claims (can tell why a person needed the service)
- Managed care encounter data (for Behavioral health)
- Dental services
- We know what other health insurance coverage people have, just not what those claims are
- Other data sources, like NCI
- Geography
 - County, zip code, personal address – must meet HIPAA restrictions when reporting data



Next Sprint Group – Claims Data Brainstorm

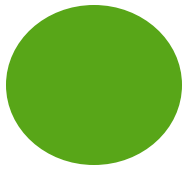
Examples of Questions for Sprint Group to Build On:

Network Adequacy

- Proportion of waiver members to service providers by county
- Which percentage of member's are authorized for a service and start receiving the service within 30 days
- Distance from service provider to member's address

Transitions

- How many people transitioned from institution to community in a given timeframe?
- How many people were admitted to a NF in a given timeframe?
- How many hospital admissions were there for people receiving HCBS services in a given timeframe, and what were the top 5 reasons for admission?
