
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


Gender Identity

An individual's innate sense of being male, female, an amalgamation of male and female or neither

GENDER EXPRESSION







SEXUAL ORIENTATION/ ATTRACTION

Difficulties for LGBTQ+ Youth

- LGBTQ+ youth who had access to spaces that affirmed their sexual orientation and gender identity reported lower rates of attempting suicide.
- 42% of LGBTQ+ youth seriously considered attempting suicide in the past year, including more than half of transgender and nonbinary youth.
- More than 80% of LGBTQ+ youth stated that COVID-19 made their living situation more stressful — and only 1 in 3 LGBTQ+ youth found their home to be LGBTQ+ -affirming.

LGBTQ+Older People

There are currently around 3 million LGBT adults over the age of 50 and that number is expected to grow to 7 million by 2030.




As an LGBT community member, if you or your spouse/partner ever needed long-term care, such as in-home assistance, assisted living or nursing home care, how concerned would you be about the following?

Health Equity

- 33% of transgender people report having at least one negative experience with a healthcare provider
- 23% of transgender people report not seeking necessary care because of a fear of mistreatment

Move Beyond Allyship

- Alternative models
 - Working in solidarity with...
 - Collaborator with...

Understand the Danger of a "Single Story"

- For example: If you have met one trans person.... you have still only met one trans person
- Resist macro-narratives
- Reframe "role models" as "possibility models"

Stay Curious

- Read books, articles, and blogs
- Follow diverse voices
- Follow leading organizations to stay informed and local organizations to help inform action



Respect Privacy

- <u>General Guideline</u>: Never share someone's sexual orientation or gender identity without their consent
- Ask for consent to share sexual orientation or gender identity information if that information feels essential for support. (E.G. caregivers, other professionals)

Ask Appropriate Questions To Guide Your Solidarity

In general, do not ask questions about someone's body, transition process, or intimate life unless it is relevant to care you are providing.

- Ask yourself: Will this question help you support this individual?
- Question Examples:
 - How may I support you?
 - How may I accompany you?

Show Respect by Using Correct Pronouns

- Proactively share your name and pronoun:
 - Example: "My name is Avery, and my pronouns are she and her."
- Ask appropriate questions:
 - Example: "May I ask your pronouns?"

Correct Mistakes

- Correct mistakes proactively
- Gently correct others
- Get curious alongside the individuals most impacted to guide solidarity
