### What is a Waiver?

Home and Community Based Services (HCBS) Waivers are programs offering **services and benefits** to help people with **specific health conditions** live more independently in the community. Waiver programs give you

## Children With Life Limiting Illness (CLLI) Waiver

If your child has a **life-limiting illness**, the CLLI Waiver can provide support in the home to allow you and your family to seek curative treatment while your child is receiving palliative or hospice care.

### Services Available

- Palliative/Supportive Care: Counseling/Bereavement
  - Care coordination including a care plan, regular home visits to monitor health and safety
  - Pain and symptom management

#### Counseling/Bereavement Services

- Expressive Therapy
- Massage Therapy
- Respite Care
- Therapeutic Life Limiting
  Illness Support

### How can I get these services?

#### Your child may qualify if they:

- Are **age 0-18** with a **disability** as defined by the Social Security Administration (SSA)
- Have a life-limiting illness certified by a physician
- Have **medical needs similar to** what is provided in a **hospital**

#### If your child is a Health First Colorado member:

**Contact your local Case Management Agency** to see if your child qualifies for the CLLI Waiver.

A Case Management Agency (CMA) helps you see if this program is right for your child and helps you find services.

### If they're NOT a Health First Colorado member:
