What is a Waiver?

Home and Community Based Services (HCBS) Waivers are programs offering **services and benefits** to help people with **specific health conditions** live more independently in the community. Waiver programs give you

choice, control, and access to



an array of supportive services.

Children's Extensive Support (CES) Waiver

The CES Waiver provides services and supports to help your child get their needs met. Services help to establish a foundation for community inclusion as they grow into adulthood.

How can I get these services?

Your child may qualify if they:

- Are age 0-17 and live at home
- Have an intellectual or developmental disability or developmental delay if under age 5
- Have long-term care needs similar to what is provided in an institution for children with developmental disabilities
- Require direct human intervention for behavioral or medical conditions every two hours during the day and some overnight intervention throughout the week; such as, preventing them from hurting themselves/others or damaging property, or addressing constant vocalizations

If your child is a Health First Colorado member: Contact your local Case Management Agency to see if they gualify for the Children's Extensive Support Waiver.

If they're NOT a Health First Colorado member: Contact your local CMA, or apply online at: co.gov/PEAK
