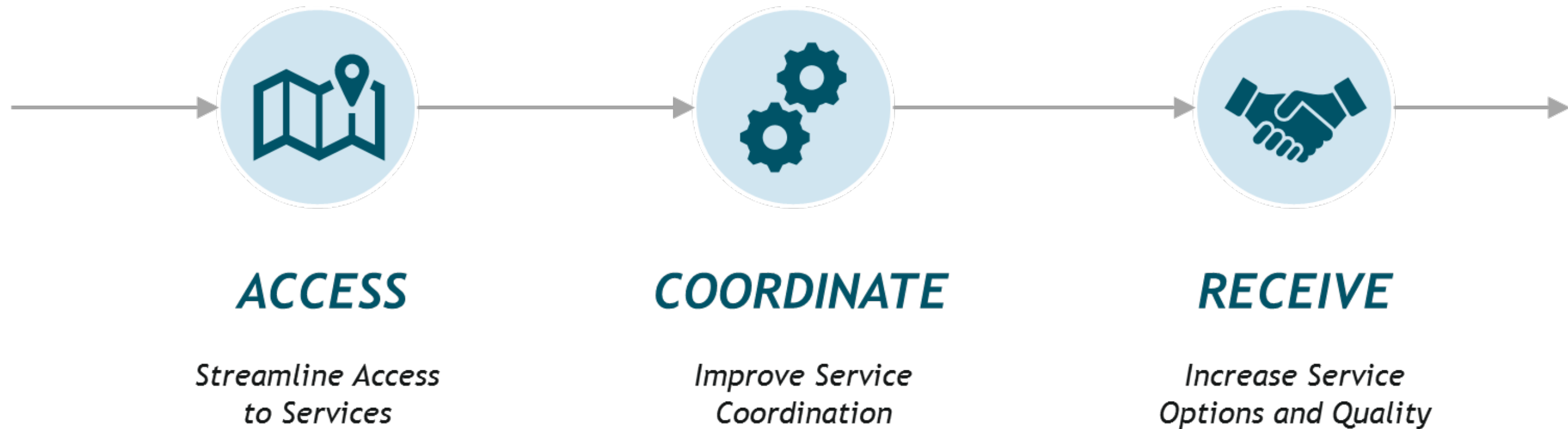

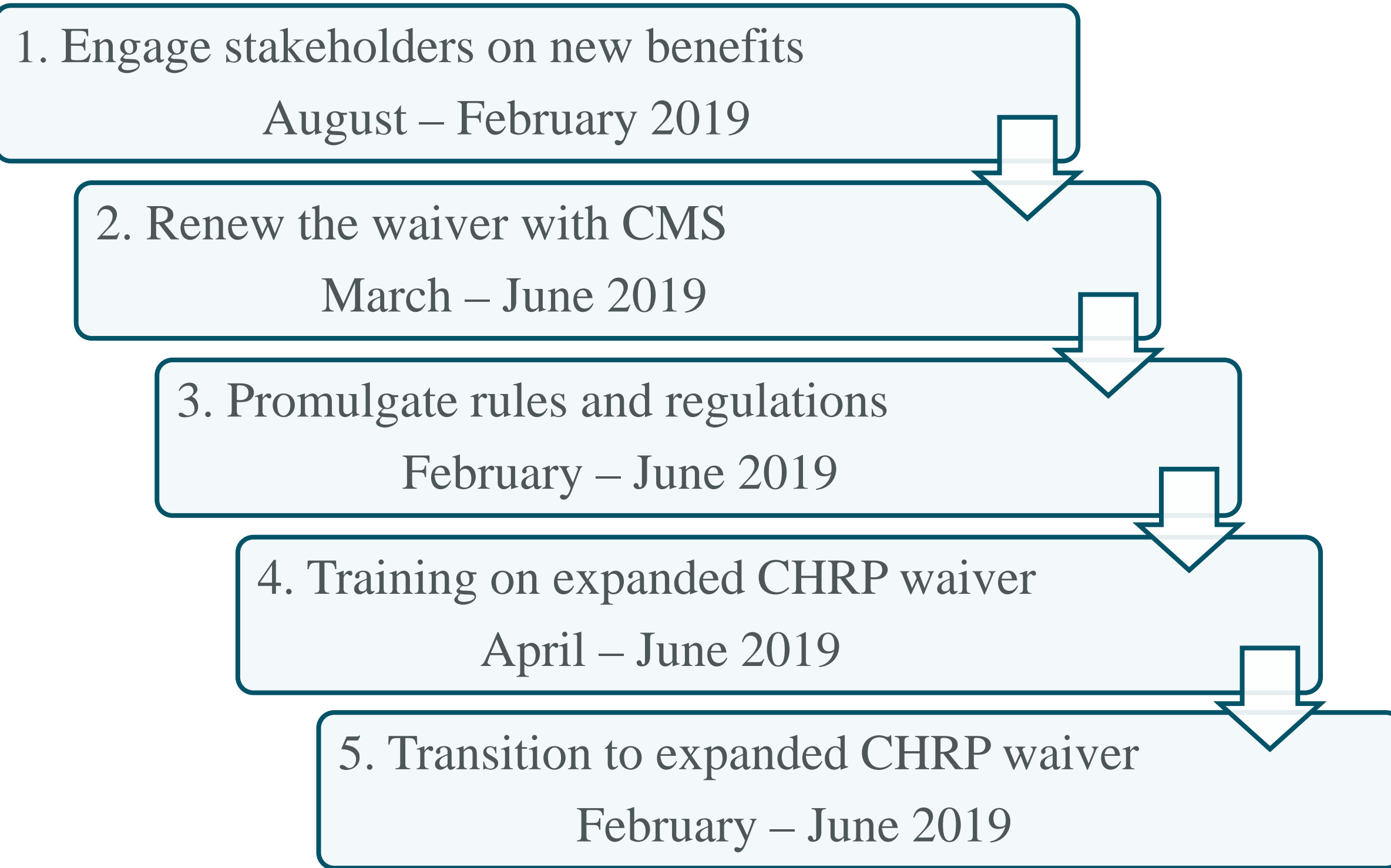
The What

The Department received the authority through HB 18-1328 to expand the CHRP waiver to better serve children with complex behavioral support needs.

Modifications include:

- Transfer of the administration of the CHRP waiver from CDHS to the Department.
- Removal of requirement that the child be in foster care.
- Addition of two new services to the waiver to mitigate the need for an out of home placement and facilitate transition to the home from out of home placement.
- Transfer of case management from County Departments of Human Services to Case Management Agencies (specifically Community Centered Boards-CCBs).

Changes to Respite

- Adding 15 minute unit reimbursement

Residential (Habilitation)

Twenty-four (24) hour service that includes:

- Independent living training
- Self-advocacy training
- Cognitive services
- Emergency assistance
- Community access supports
- Transportation
- Follow-up supports for counseling, behavioral, or other therapeutic interventions
- Medical and health care support supports

Residential (Habilitation) Services - Provider Types *(cont'd)*

Medicaid Enrolled Provider

- Program Approved Service Agency (PASA) certified to provide Residential Habilitation Services for the HCBS-Developmental Disabilities (DD) waiver.

And

- Only in a Foster Care Home certified by a County Department of Human Services.

Respite

- For the short-term relief of the primary caregiver.
- May be provided in the family home, community, Foster Care Home, group home, and/or RCCF.
- Service Limit: Not more than seven (7) consecutive days per month, not to exceed twenty-eight (28) days per calendar year.
- Capacity Limits: same capacity limits apply as in Habilitation services.
- Respite may not be billed on the same day as Habilitation services.

Respite - Provider Types

- Child Placement Agency
- Foster Care Home
- Medicaid Enrolled Provider

Supported Community Connections

- One-on-one supports to deliver instruction for documented severe behavior problems exhibited by the child or youth in the community.
- Service must be provided in a setting in the community where the child or youth interacts with individuals without disabilities.
- Service is limited to five (5) hours per week.

Supported Community Connections- Rates and Provider Types

Rate	Unit Value
\$9.85	15 minute unit increment

- Child Placement Agency

Massage Therapy

- The physical manipulation of muscles to ease muscle contractures, spasms, extension, muscle relaxation, and muscle tension including WATSU.
- Must be a treatment strategy for an identified medical need and recommended or prescribed by a therapist or physician.
- Recommending therapist or physician must monitor the progress and effectiveness at least quarterly.

Hippotherapy

- Therapeutic treatment strategy that uses the movement of a horse to assist in the development/enhancement of skills including gross motor, sensory integration, attention, cognitive, social, behavioral, and communication skills.
- Must be a treatment strategy for an identified medical need and recommended or prescribed by a therapist or physician.
- Recommending therapist or physician must monitor the progress and effectiveness at least quarterly.

Movement Therapy

- The use of music and/or dance as a therapeutic tool for the habilitation, rehabilitation, and maintenance of behavioral, developmental, physical, social, communication, pain management, cognition, and gross motor skills.
- Must be a treatment strategy for an identified medical need and recommended or prescribed by a therapist or physician.
- Recommending therapist or physician must monitor the progress and effectiveness at least quarterly.

Massage, Hippo, and Movement Therapy - Rates and Provider Types

Medicaid Enrolled Provider licensed, certified, and/or accredited to provide service.

Intensive Supports

- Aligns strategies, interventions, and supports for the child or youth, and their family to prevent the need for out of home placement.
- Utilized to maintain stabilization, prevent Crisis situations, and/or de-escalation of Crisis situations.
- Wraparound Facilitator
- In-Home Supports

Wraparound

Wraparound is an individualized approach to help children with complex needs. Service providers, support team members, the child and their family and/or caregiver(s) all work together to help achieve the family's goals. The team respects the goals and strengths of the family to help build confidence and successes for the child and the family at home, in school and in the community.

Transition Support Services

- Aligns strategies, interventions, and supports for the child or youth, and their family, when a child or youth transitions to the family home from out of home placement.
- Wraparound Transition Facilitation
- In-Home Supports

Eligibility

CHRP Waiver Eligibility

Proposed

Children and youth ages birth (0) through twenty (20):

- Eligible for developmental disability services through the respective Community Centered Board
- Meets Intermediate Care Facility for Individuals with Intellectual Disabilities (ICF/IID)(as defined in 42 CFR §440.150)
- Has extraordinary needs that put them at risk of, or in need of, out of home placement.

Extraordinary Needs Defined

Complex behavioral and/or medical support needs – that put them at risk of, or in need of, out-of-home placement or institutional care.

Extraordinary Needs require a level of care due to **Complex behavior** or **Medical support** needs that is provided in a residential child care facility or through a community based program. If the eligible child doesn't receive this care, they are at risk of unwarranted child welfare involvement or other system involvement.

Provider Enrollment

Provider Enrollment

- Currently enrolled Medicaid providers - add provider type 36 (HCBS waiver) and CHRP specialty 619
- Currently enrolled Medicaid HCBS waiver providers - add CHRP specialty 619
- New providers (not currently enrolled as Medicaid provider) - complete DXC enrollment process, provider type 36, and CHRP specialty 619
