Colorado Rural Health Transformation Program Process

Communication Purpose

This communication is intended to answer questions on the process being undertaken to: (a) complete and submit the Rural Health Transformation Program (RHTP) application to the federal government for funding, and (b) manage the dissemination of federally awarded grant dollars. It is also intended to clarify that a Rural Health Transformation Advisory Council will be established, when, and for what purpose.

RHTP Application Completion & Submission.

Clearly, this federal grant opportunity is very important to many rural providers, their associations and representatives, as well as other stakeholders. This RHTP Application Completion & Submission process is intended to ensure a flexible and targeted stakeholder engagement that allows the Department of Health Care Policy & Financing (HCPF) to reach a broad array of voices who want to be heard, and to be responsive to those voices, while operating agilely, with fewer bottlenecks, and transparently. It further enables the state to meet the application completion and submission deadline of early November, as currently targeted by CMS. CMS is indicating that notice of grant awards will be public by December 31, 2025.

Stakeholder Engagement. Initial stakeholder engagement began in August 2025. As soon as the RHTP application is released from CMS, expected the week of Sept. 15, 2025, HCPF will work with stakeholders to create and aggregate the application content through an Application Core Working Group and additional stakeholder meetings and opportunities for input and feedback.

The RHTP Application Core Working Group is expected to begin the week of Sept. 22, 2025, and will include those who wish to participate from the following categories:

To ensure active stakeholder engagement, project completion, and transparent communications, HCPF is also committed to:

- Regular updates via email and newsletters each week
- Targeted check-ins and working sessions with key individuals and group
- Weekly working sessions internally so we continue moving forward.

Following Colorado's RHTP application submission to CMS, HCPF will convene a formal RHTP Advisory Council to:

- Develop request for applications for grantees
- Review applications for funding
- Recommend grant awards
- Support ongoing program administration, such as grantee monitoring, federal reporting, and award revisions.
