Provider Qualifications

Why We Are Here

- Waivers allow different provider qualifications for waiver services
 - Personal care and homemaker are two services that have different provider qualifications between the IDD and non-IDD waivers
- CFC benefits must be the same for all qualifying members
- CFC will require the same provider qualifications for these services

Background on Provider Qualifications

- Provider qualifications are the set of requirements that a provider must meet to provide a service
 - > 1915 (c) waivers allow for these requirements to differ between waivers
- Part of moving proposed services into CFC will require merging provider qualifications into one unified requirement

Where the Differences Come From

IDD Waivers

- Children's Extensive Support (CES)
- Supported Living Services (SLS)
- Developmental Disabilities (DD)
 - Does not have personal care or homemaker
- Children's Habilitation Residential Program (CHRP)

Non-IDD Waivers

- Brain Injury (BI)
- Community Mental Health Supports (CMHS)
- Elderly, Blind, and Disabled (EBD)
- Complementary and Integrative Health (CIH) (formerly Spinal Cord Injury)
- Children's Home and Community Based Services (CHCBS)
- Children with Life-Limiting Illness (CLLI)

Current Provider Qualifications Across Waivers: Personal Care and Homemaker

Home Care Agencies (HCAs)

Personal Care and Homemaker Provider Qualification Issue

- Difference is the provider signed attestation PASA's which:
 - Do not provide hands-on assistance, or
 - Only have one employee
 - Do not need to have a license
- CFC will require the same provider qualifications for these services

Licensure Information

Regulated under CDPHE

- 6 CCR 1011-1 Chapter 26 HCA licensing rules found at section 2.10
- 6 CCR 1011-1 Chapter 2: General Licensure Standards
- Types of Licensure
 - Class A (medical)
 - Class B (non-medical)
- Class B license costs \$2,200 with a revalidation fee \$1,325 every 5 years
