## What is a Waiver?

Home and Community Based Services (HCBS) Waivers are programs offering **services and benefits** to help people with **specific health conditions** live more independently in the community. Waiver programs give you

a full array of supportive services.



## Complementary and Integrative Health (CIH) Waiver

If you have a **nervous system condition which prevents you from moving around on your own**, the CIH Waiver can provide **support to you in your home or community.**

### How can I get these services?

#### You may qualify if you:

- Are 18 or older
- Have a spinal cord injury (traumatic or non-traumatic), multiple sclerosis, brain injury, spina bifida, muscular dystrophy, or cerebral palsy
- Require assistance to move around

#### If you are a Health First Colorado member:

**Contact your local Case Management Agency** to see if you qualify for the CIH Waiver.

A Case Management Agency (CMA) helps you see if this program is right for you and helps you find services.
