

### **Background: Cover All Coloradans**







"Look a Like" Program

New Medicaid & CHP+
look-alike program
Children under 19
Pregnant people



Meet all eligibility requirements for Medicaid & CHP+ except for immigration



Implement no later than Jan 1, 2025
Reporting begins 2024
JBC/SMART





All Medicaid and CHP+
benefits should be the
same for new populations

Infrastructure

Consistency

Coverage

Eligibility

All infrastructure should be the same for expansion populations

Presumptive Eligibility available to new populations

Extends 12-month continuous coverage to pregnant people



### Requirement 1

Must improve the health of eligible children, but can also be used for children of any income



### Requirement 2

HSIs can be funded within the 10% allotment for administration from the CHP+ program



### Requirement 3

Bill specifies a community engagement process for determining priorities

HSIs are an option under CHIP to create programs to improve the health of low-income children

### **OmniSalud**

A health coverage program for people without documentation

Earning <150% FPL


You qualify for <u>SilverEnhanced</u>
<u>Savings</u> plans. These plans have
\$0 monthly premiums and cover
94% of medical expenses.

Earning ≥150% FPL

You qualify for a full-price
Colorado Option plan. These plans
include many high value services
at no cost.







OmniSalud: a program that allows
Coloradans without documentation
(including DACA) to shop for and
compare health insurance plans on
Colorado Connect

SilverEnhanced Savings: financial help that is available for CO Option plans for Coloradans without documentation <150% FPL





### SilverEnhanced Savings Eligibility

-Colorado Resident (someone who lives in Colorado)

-Ineligible for other affordability programs (such as CHP+, Medicaid, financial help through Connect for Health Colorado)

-Income: Below 150% FPL



### What incomes qualify for SilverEnhanced Savings?

To qualify for \$0 premiums, customers must be under 150% of the Federal Poverty Level (FPL).

### **Cover All Coloradans Lactation Benefit & Services**

- Single-user electric breast pump coverage
  - Expanded to include all pregnant and postpartum members as of June 8, 2022
- Multi-user electric breast pump coverage
  - Not yet available, communication can be expected in the next couple months.

### What the Legislation Says:

- Engage with impacted individuals
- Publicize meeting notes in Spanish and English
- Meet outside of regular working hours
- Conduct at least five stakeholder meetings

## Cover All Coloradans: Key Informant Interview Findings So Far



- Prioritize voices of people impacted by the Bill
- People impacted by the bill should decide how to use the Health Services Initiative funds
- Engage communities beyond Spanish-speaking communities
- Utilize trusted community members as messengers
- Offer meetings at multiple times and in multiple formats
- Facilitate meetings in the appropriate languages
