
1. Assessment of need and qualification for SUD services









#### 2. Access to Critical Levels of Care for OUD and other SUDs (Milestone 1)







Total Members in receipt of SUD services DY1 (Metric #6 Unduplicated number is black line; Metrics #7-12 are in the stacked areas)




Total Members in receipt of SUD services DY1 (Metric #6 Unduplicated number is black line; Metrics #7-12 are in the stacked areas)


