What is a Waiver?

Home and Community Based Services (HCBS) Waivers are programs offering services and benefits to help people with specific health conditions live more independently in the community. Waiver programs give you

choice, control, and access to a full array of supportive services.



Developmental Disabilities (DD) Waiver

This waiver can provide you with access to 24-hour support for your intellectual or developmental disability and help you live in your home or community.

Services Available*

- Behavioral Services
- Day Habilitation Services (Specialized Habilitation, Supported Community Connections)
- HCBS Dental Services
- Home Delivered Meals
- Non-Medical Transportation
 Transition Set Up
- Peer Mentorship

- Prevocational Services
- Residential Habilitation Services (individual, group, or family)
- Specialized Medical **Equipment and Supplies**
- Supported Employment
- Vision Services
- * There is a waiting list to receive services.

How can I get these services?

You may qualify if you:

- Are 18 or older with an intellectual or developmental disability
- Require access to services 24 hours a day
- Need long-term support services like those provided in a facility for adults with developmental disabilities

If you are a Health First Colorado member:

Contact your local Case Management Agency to see if you qualify for the Developmental Disabilities Waiver.

A Case Management Agency (CMA) helps you see if this program is right for you and helps you find services.
