Katie LoNigro (HCPF):	Thanks for asking this, [Attendee]! We are still exploring ways that RAEs can support food-related assistance for members, and this could certainly be one way. We appreciate any feedback on how else RAEs could be of support.
Attendee:	When it is clear a member is confused and has complex care needs, it is critical that member gets connected to a complex care case manager immediately.
Attendee:	As a PCP, you are  right about the current situation and how the clinical community has not been taught to provide inclusive care

Much of what you discuss is focal to the DCCBH Training, and was highlighted in the Co-Occurring Disability and Behavioral Health Steering Committee Report shared out earlier. The role of "behavior" really resonates, as I hear that in Complex Cases every week, when in fact, it may be a trauma response, a physical ailment, mental/behavioral health symptom, or simply a difference in opinion regarding whether or not someone ought to be allowed to have the agency they desire. Thank you for raising this!

Attendee:	There are similar issues with language (non ASL) access and equity and also contingency plan for patients when practices don't meet the expectations, there is a way to still get the care access they need. I would hate to see a patient have to wait for the provider community to catch up, a transition plan is needed now :(

Attendee:	Perhaps an administrator competency training
Cody Hickman (HCPF):	Another great point [Attendee]! The National Center for START Services refers to this as the "biopsychosocial" approach, and we agree, this is vital.
