What is a Waiver?

Home and Community Based Services (HCBS) Waivers are programs offering **services and benefits** to help people with **specific health conditions** live more independently in the community. Waiver programs give you

choice, control, and access to an array of supportive services.



Elderly, Blind, and Disabled Waiver

The EBD Waiver helps people **18 and older** receive **long-term services and supports** in their homes and communities, rather than a nursing facility.

How can I get these services?

You may qualify if you:

- Are 18 or older and need long-term care
- Have an illness, disability or HIV/AIDS diagnosis making it difficult to live independently
- Need significant help with daily activities like bathing, dressing or mobility
