



Family Planning Expansion Benefit Resources

Effective July 1, 2022 Health First Colorado (Colorado’s Medicaid program):

- Ensures that any pregnant person enrolled in Health First Colorado is guaranteed postpartum services for up to 12 months after their pregnancy ends.
- Covers family planning and family planning-related services for individuals with an income greater than the standard Medicaid limit.
- Covers a 12-month supply of contraceptives for everyone on Medicaid regardless of their immigration or citizenship status.
- Individuals are presumptively eligible for coverage of family planning and family planning related services.
- Expands preventive services and redefines family planning related as services eligible outside managed care organizations and without co-pays.

Legislative Policy Summary

Bill Number	Bill Summary and Intended Impact
<u>SB 21-194</u>	<i>Maternal Health Providers:</i> Extends postpartum coverage to 365 days for persons who qualified for medical assistance benefits while pregnant. This will allow the pregnant person to maintain access to services during the postpartum period beyond the former 60-day coverage period.
<u>SB 21-009</u>	<i>Reproductive Health Care Program:</i> Required family planning coverage for individuals regardless of immigration or citizenship status.
<u>SB 21-025</u>	<i>Family Planning Service for Eligible Individuals:</i> Requires Health First Colorado to provide family planning and family planning related services to individuals up to 260% of the Federal Poverty Level (FPL).
<u>SB 21-016</u>	<i>Protecting Preventative Health Care Coverage:</i> Expands preventive services and redefines family planning related as services eligible outside managed care organizations and without co-pays.
