Fiscal Year 2022 Year End Report



The Department and CUSOM jointly developed an Access to Health Care Framework to guide project development and align evaluation efforts. The Supplemental Funding Program leverages this framework in all aspects of program design, implementation, and evaluation.



Services

- 95 projects focused on direct patient care, telemedicine, and rural and frontier counties
- CUSOM serves members in all 64 Colorado counties
- 102% telemedicine growth since 2020 with 36,681 telemedicine visits and 18,975 unique members seen in 2022
- 61,769 primary care medical home visits
- 176,121 unique members seen in 37 specialty care areas
- 19,367 unique members seen for behavioral health
- 7 locations for integrated care across Denver Metro



Coverage



- Funding supports 700 staff across Colorado
- 35 medical students received scholarships
- Expanding workforce to include peer support specialists

Workforce

- Community partners are Arapahoe County Jail, City of Aurora, Aurora Health Alliance, and STRIDE
- Transitions of care for members experiencing housing instability and released from jail

- 967 eConsults sent from 490 unique providers
- Average eConsult response time of 41 hours
- eConsults result in a 9.35% cost reduction
- 35 ECHO series in 60 topic areas with over half of providers serving Medicaid members
