Purpose and Audience:

The purpose of this Informational Memo is for the Programs of All-Inclusive Care for the Elderly (PACE) organizations to be informed of an extension date granted by the Department of Health Care Policy & Financing (Department) regarding 10 CCR 2505-10 8,497.8.D.2.b.

Information:

The State PACE Regulations went into effect April 30, 2024 and must be implemented by July 1, 2024, with one exception:

- The Department has agreed to extend the start date for submitting PACE Participant Visit Reports.
- If a participant does not receive a visit during a calendar month, the PACE organization must notify the Department, in writing, within 15 calendar days of the following calendar month.
- The notice must explain the reason(s) why the participant did not receive a visit.
