

#### HTP Scoring Framework - Updated May 19, 2022

The HTP Scoring Framework has been updated as of May 19, 2022, and is posted on our <u>website</u> under the Hospital Transformation Program Overview and Framework section. Please contact us through the <u>HTP inbox</u> with questions.

To assist hospitals with successfully completing all required HTP quarterly reporting activities, we have published a comprehensive quarterly reporting guide titled HTP Quarterly Reporting Guide. The guide includes important information such as:

- Overview of the various types of quarterly reporting (CHNE, interim, milestone, performance measures)
- Quarterly reporting schedule
- Deep dive into interim and CHNE reporting including the requirements, submission, scoring and achievement review criteria, scoring review and reconsideration period, etc.
- Deep dive into milestone reporting including the requirements, submission, scoring and achievement review criteria, scoring review and reconsideration period, milestone amendments, course corrections, etc.
- Qualtrics survey prompts that will be used for interim and CHNE reporting
  - The Qualtrics survey prompts for milestone reporting and more details on performance measure reporting will be added to the guide at a later date.

#### **Community Engagement Resource**

The Assessing Community Engagement project from the National Academy of Medicine (NAM) <u>Leadership Consortium: Collaboration for a Value & Science-Driven Health</u>

<u>System</u> is funded by the Robert Wood Johnson Foundation. Guided by a committee of national and community leaders who reflect diverse backgrounds and perspectives, the project aims to provide community-engaged, effective, and evidence-based tools to those who want to measure engagement to ensure that it is meaningful and impactful,

with a special emphasis on ensuring equity as a critical input and outcome. As part of this effort, the Organizing Committee developed the <u>Assessing Community Engagement Conceptual Model (ACE-CoM)</u>, which identifies outcomes associated with meaningful community engagement. #### Regional Health Connector (RHC) Program

Regional Health Connector (RHC) program! In 2021, the RHC program received funding from Senate Bill 21-137 to improve mental and behavioral health systems across the state of Colorado. Each RHC conducted regional assessments by analyzing national, state, and local data to identify priority gaps in behavioral and mental health services. Based on this data, RHCs proposed projects intended to address these priority gaps and improve health equity using local knowledge, services, and assets. Trailhead Institute shares a summary of the Behavioral Health Recovery Act (BHRA) projects that resulted from this funding and process. Also featured are two stories of impact that illustrate how the BHRA funding was utilized: Culture as Prevention in Southwest Colorado and Building Bridges to Muslim Youth for Positive Impact.

### Colorado AIM Substance Use Disorder Learning Collaborative

Is your hospital L&D unit interested in improving screening, identification, and care for birthing patients with substance use disorder, perinatal depression or anxiety, or challenges with social determinants of health?

The <u>Colorado Perinatal Care Quality Collaborative</u> (CPCQC) runs the *Colorado AIM*: Substance Use Disorder Learning Collaborative, a quality improvement cohort of perinatal providers implementing the Alliance for Innovation in Maternal Health (AIM) patient safety bundle for <u>Care for Pregnant & Postpartum People with Substance Use Disorder</u>, with added emphasis on depression, anxiety, social needs, and continuity of care.

The Collaborative began in 2021 and is now made up of hospitals that deliver 51.4% of all Colorado births! Hospitals that participated in 2021 saw 144% increase in overall comprehensive universal screening for anxiety, depression, and substance use. Hospital labor & delivery units and outpatient obstetric practices receive provider education via monthly Coaching Calls (open to the public!), customized technical assistance, and data insights to improve care, with the ultimate goal of reducing deaths from the top two causes of maternal death in Colorado: suicide and accidental overdose. You may register for the monthly Coaching Call series, which provides CE credit. Calls are on the second Thursday of the month from 12-1 p.m. MT.
