Inpatient Hospital Review Program (IHRP) 2.0: Joint Operating Committee (JOC) February 2, 2023

<u>Updates</u>

The initial IHRP 2.0 launch date has been pushed back by one month due to stakeholder feedback. However, the Department and Kepro will still have everything in place on April 3 for providers to begin testing their connectivity, processes and understanding of the program during a "Soft Launch" up until May 1, 2023. We encourage everyone to take advantage of this time, during which the Department will monitor for problems, training opportunities or program improvements. Claims submitted to the Fiscal Agent will not deny for lack of PAR until dates of service are on and after May 1, 2023.

Frequently Asked Questions

Department staff have compiled responses to the questions that have been posed so far regarding IHRP 2.0. This Q&A will be posted on the <u>Department's IHRP website</u> (https://hcpf.colorado.gov/IHRP) and updated over the next several months.

Post Admission Review

The Department previously shared the components that will go into Post Admission Reviews. Today we are sharing the actual questions that will be Atrezzo for Post Admission Reviews at Day 6, 30, and every 30 days thereafter. The good news for providers is that there is document upload required, just checkboxes and free text questions including:

- 1. Member has a complex discharge/transition plan, does the hospital request outreach and assistance from the Member's RAE? Provide any additional details for the RAEs in notes section.
- 2. Has a Health-Related Social Needs Screening (HRSN) been completed? If so, please identify which needs were identified check all that apply. (Check Boxes)
- 3. What is the anticipated level of care upon discharge/transition? (Check Boxes)
- 4. Are there barriers to member's discharge anticipated or identified? If yes, please identify the barriers. (Yes/No checkbox with text field for additional details)
- 5. Are there identified comorbidities and/or chronic conditions that are affecting or preventing the members transition or discharge? If yes, please identify in the text box.
- 6. Is Member expected to discharge/transition with more than 10 medications? Provide any additional details in notes section.
- Member is pending transition/discharge but has new needs that may be a barrier to transition/discharge? (Check All that Apply): DME, Supplies, PDN, Home Health, Personal Care Services, PT, OT, ST, Other
- 8. Has the hospital identified a risk of readmission for the member?
- 9. Additional Clinical Notes and information for the RAEs
