WHAT


- Lookalike program (Medicaid and CHP+)

 - System Navigation
 - Postpartum Coverage

WHEN

• Program goes live January 1, 2025

Potential Impacts to You

- Additional Language Services Needs
 - Must have language services available or may need to expand translation abilities
- Unervices, OmniSalud insurance
- May have certain ideas/stigmas/biases against this population
- Ex. Requiring documentation for citizenship for programs that don't require it derstanding how this population could flow through available programs
 - Cover All Coloradans, Emergency Medicaid/Family Planning Services, OmniSalud insurance
- Potential workload increase with new population

CMA PEAKPro Referrals

- LTSS Automatic Referral Process
- ***Update*** Effective 11/1/2024
 - Memo OM 24-026 Long-Term Care Level of Care Streamline Process to reflect that the automated referral process will go live November 1st, 2024 instead of July 1st, 2024.
 - CBMS Communication sent 6/21/24
 - Starting 11/1/24
 - Automatically sends Referral to CMA PEAKPro In-Box when:
 - Decision = Pending
 - LOC Type = Undetermined
 - Date Referral Submitted captured within CBMS

The current manual process will remain the same; after 11/1/2024, there may still be instances when a manual referral is necessary.



What's Happening Now

- Reinstate coverage using the State Override functionality
 - Starting with February 2024 terminations and continue monthly (end month TBD)
- Mitigate terminations and future reinstatements
 - Pending State Help Desk Ticket records added to LTSS and Buy-In cases on 3/20/2024
- Renewal Extension
 - Update renewal extension from 60 days to 120 days



What's Happening Now

- Extend LTC Level of Care (LOC) certification end dates in CBMS
 - CBMS Project 9471, Implemented April 13, 2024
 - At EDBC run, apply a 12-month extension (on the back end) to all LTC LOC certification record end dates that are ending as of 3/1/2024 or later
- Process the backlog of LOC certifications
 - CBMS Project 9706: First file transmitted on 05/04/2024
 - Process files from the Care and Case Management (CCM) System for current LTC LOC certification records that are not currently available in CBMS
 - Impacted members identified through recent terminations and/or pending/undetermined LOC certification records in CBMS





What's Coming

- 60 Day (2 month) Eligibility Extension for members that have their benefits reduced or terminated
 - CBMS Project 9472, Implementation Date 8/10/2024
 - Applies to all benefit reduction reasons, with exceptions:
 - Incarceration
 - POI (existing)
 - \circ Applies to all termination reasons, with exceptions:
 - Death
 - No longer a CO resident
 - No longer requesting assistance
 - Incarceration (secondary MSP aid codes)



What's Coming

- All members who are receiving an extension to their eligibility will receive a notice to inform them of the extension and notifying them that their eligibility will terminate if the eligibility requirements are not met
 - The notice will direct the members to check PEAK for any verifications or other information that is needed
 - Members may reach out to counties for additional assistance and clarification
- Eligibility will run on the 10th of the 2nd month of the extension to determine ongoing eligibility for the member
 - If the member is found to not meet all eligibility requirements for LTC, they will terminate and will receive a termination notice at that time.



What's Coming

Examples:

 Ongoing medical assistance case. Member is approved for HCBS. The member reports a change that is processed on 08/30/2024. This change makes the member ineligible for HCBS because she is over resources. This member would normally terminate (with 10day noticing) 9/30/2024.

Result: The member will not terminate 9/30/2024. The member will force-pass for 60 days. The new iNOA and the new speed letter will be triggered. If there are no changes to this case, the member will terminate 11/30/2024. A termination NOA will be triggered with an 11/30/2024 termination date Ongoing medical assistance case. Member is approved for PACE and QMB . The member's family reports a change on 08/05/2024. The change is processed on 8/15/2024. The member passed away on 7/25/2024.

Result: This member will terminate back to the date of death 7/25/2024. The member will NOT force-pass for 60 days. The new iNOA and speed letter will not be triggered. The termination NOA will be triggered with a 07/25/2024 termination date.
