



Join Us to Discuss the Health First Colorado Maternity Bundled Payment Pilot Program!

The Colorado Department of Health Care Policy and Financing is seeking stakeholder feedback on a voluntary bundled payment pilot program. The Department intends to implement the voluntary pilot program with interested participants starting July 1, 2020.

The voluntary pilot program will focus on maternal care. Improving maternal health is a key goal of the State of Colorado and utilizing an episode-based approach has been shown to improve quality while effectively managing costs. The maternity episode will include prenatal, delivery, and postpartum care.

Three public meetings will be held in March 2020 to solicit stakeholder feedback on the program. The content of the meetings will build from one meeting to the next and stakeholders are encouraged to attend as many meetings as possible. The purpose of the third meeting is to discuss specific changes to the pilot program that the Department is considering based on stakeholder feedback.
