

Cover All Coloradans Top Facts

What is Cover All Coloradans?

- A new law called "Cover All Coloradans" lets children and pregnant people, no matter what their immigration status is, apply to get health coverage through Health First Colorado (Colorado's Medicaid program) and Child Health Plan *Plus* (CHP+).
- Effective Jan. 1, 2025, children and pregnant people who qualify, no matter what their immigration status is, may access the same support and services as Health First Colorado and CHP+ members.

Who Should Apply?

These groups should apply now, no matter what their immigration status is to see if they qualify:

- Pregnant people
- People whose pregnancy ends on or after Jan. 1, 2025
- Any child 18 or younger
- Apply for benefits anytime at: healthfirstcolorado.com/apply-now/ or by contacting your county department
 of human services.
- It might take up to 45 days to find out if you qualify

What are my options before January 1, 2025?

- Don't wait: Apply now! You may qualify for Emergency Medicaid Services/Reproductive Health Care Services (EMS/RHCS) now, regardless of your immigration status.
- The EMS/RHCS benefits cover family planning, family planning-related, and services necessary to treat an emergency medical condition for people who qualify.
- If you qualify for and get EMS/RHCS now, HCPF will check if you qualify for full Health First Colorado and CHP+ benefits through Cover All Coloradans. If you do qualify for full benefits, you will automatically receive them beginning Jan. 1, 2025, without having to apply again.

Coverage Details

• Cover All Coloradans is a Health First Colorado and CHP+ "lookalike" program. This means people who qualify for this program will get the same benefits as current Health First Colorado and CHP+ members.

What happens to people who get Cover All Coloradans benefits after their 12-month postpartum period or after they turn 19 years old?

- We will send people a renewal packet to see if they qualify. People who are beyond the 12 months of
 postpartum coverage or have turned 19 years old do not qualify for Health First Colorado benefits or CHP+.
 However, they may qualify for Emergency Medicaid Services/Reproductive Health Care Services (EMS/RHCS).
 The EMS/RHCS benefits cover family planning, family planning-related, and services necessary to treat
 emergency medical conditions for people who qualify.
 - People can also apply for health coverage through OmniSalud.

Your Information Is Private

The information on the application is private. Colorado law keeps personal information safe when an individual applies for or uses most public benefits. State workers and third parties accessing state systems are prohibited from sharing immigration information for investigation or enforcement purposes.
 Under current law, applying won't affect immigration status, and it can't be used against an individual in decisions about immigration status. Learn more about Public Charge.
