Low Dosages of many antipsychotic, anti-depressant and anti-anxiety medications are often used to treat organic conditions such as dementia rather than mental illness. However, a Level I trigger occurs if an individual is taking more of a medication than the maximum dosage listed in The Beer's List because higher dosages are often associated with mental illness.
