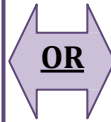

RISK FACTOR DEFINITIONS

Age 18 or younger at time of conception

Age 35 or over at time of conception

Member does not desire the pregnancy or has unresolved feelings regarding the pregnancy – Exhibits negative feelings such as resentment, fear, inadequacy and doubt about the pregnancy; may give mixed messages regarding her decision to parent

Cognitive or developmental disability – Includes women who are developmentally disabled, have traumatic brain injuries, or other cognitive impairments that reduce their ability to understand and follow education or instruction offered by providers

Education level – Has not graduated from high school, does not have a GED, or less than appropriate for age (e.g. 15 year old in 7th grade)

Has been homeless within the past 12 months – Includes living in transitional homes (e.g. shelter or motel) History of

abuse in childhood – Includes verbal, emotional, physical, or sexual abuse

History of or current domestic violence – Includes verbal, emotional, physical, or sexual abuse

History of or current mental health disorder, including depression – Mental health disorders include but are not limited to depression, panic or anxiety disorders, bipolar disorder, schizophrenia, obsessive compulsive disorder, post-traumatic stress disorder, eating disorders, dissociative disorders, and borderline personality disorders

History of previous low birth weight infant – Birth weight was 5 lbs. 8 oz. or less, or less than 2500 grams

Inadequate weight gain during pregnancy – Weight gain below the appropriate line on a prenatal weight gain grid; weight loss below pre-pregnancy weight in the 1st trimester; weight loss of 2 lbs. or more in the 2nd or 3rd trimesters; weight gain of less than 2 lbs. per month during the 2nd or 3rd trimesters; or any weight gain that falls below the expected rate of gain

Incarcerated within the past year, currently on probation or received a felony conviction within past 2-5 years – Includes any time served in jail and/or prison in the past 12 months. Does not apply to members whose convictions have been expunged

Moved to the U.S. within past 6 months as a refugee or political asylee – A refugee is an individual who is outside his/her country of nationality or, in the case of a person having no nationality, is outside any country in which he/she last habitually resided, who is unable or unwilling to return to such country because of persecution or a well-founded fear of persecution on account of race, religion, nationality, membership in a particular social group, or political opinion. Refugee status is determined by the Department of Homeland Security before a person is eligible for resettlement in the U.S. An asylee is an individual who has received permission to remain in the U.S., under Section 208 of the Immigration and Nationality Act, based on a “well founded fear of persecution” should the individual return to his/her native land. A prospective asylee applies for this permission from within the U.S. unlike a refugee who applies from abroad.

Not married – Includes single women and women who are living with a partner but not married; common-law marriages and women who are pursuing divorce, but are not yet divorced, are considered married

Pre-pregnancy BMI greater than or equal to 30 kg/m² – Use the BMI chart, wheel, or other calculation to determine member’s BMI according to height and known or estimated weight prior to conception

Pre-pregnancy BMI less than 18.5 kg/m² – Use the BMI chart, wheel, or other calculation to determine member’s BMI according to height and known or estimated weight prior to conception

Recent delivery – Less than 12 months between date of last delivery and date of conception

Recent or current alcohol use – Any current use of alcohol; any use after conception, including prior to knowledge of pregnancy; any use within the 3 months prior to conception

Recent or current illicit drug use – Any current use of marijuana, cocaine, heroin, amphetamines or other illicit drug, or misuse of prescription drugs; any use after conception, including prior to knowledge of pregnancy; any use within the 3 months prior to conception

Recent or current smoker – Any current use of tobacco; any tobacco use after conception, including prior to knowledge of pregnancy; any use within the 3 months prior to conception

Social Support – Having a network of family, friends, neighbors, and community members that are available during times of need to give psychological, physical, and financial help
