5. eConsult Update

Dana Chang, HCPF Data Report SFY23-24

- eConsult Overview:
 - Colorado Medicaid eConsult is Live as of 2/1/24

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- eConsults provide asynchronous (store and forward) communications between a Primary Care Medical Provider (PCMP) and a Specialty Provider
- Safety Net Connect (SNC) is the selected vendor for operating the States's eConsult Platform.
- Colorado Medicaid eConsult is a free, web-based platform. A web browser and internet connection are the only technology required to access the platform. No software installation is required.
- PCMPs can use multiple eConsult platforms (not tied to just one system/platform).
- Single Sign On (SSO) capability with most Electronic Health Records (EHRs).
- $\circ~$ In SFY 23-24, 44 PCMP sites have been trained with a total of 135 trained Providers.
- Feedback from Providers:
 - Easy to use and very efficient
 - Specialist responded within 24 hours
 - Very helpful since there are not any endocrine doctors taking any new Medicaid patients
 - Quicker consults that don't necessarily need an in person visit
 - Easy to help PCMPs select patient care
 - Interface is very easy to understand
- February there were 5 eConsults and in August the Department saw a growth to 85 eConsults!
- PCMP Enrollment to Date 2/1/24 to 8/31/24
 - Total Trained Practice Sites: 11 Practice Sites
 - \circ $\,$ Total Enrolled and Trained Providers: 255 Providers $\,$

6. SHS Program (School Health Services)

Olga Gintchin, HCPF

Program Overview

- Any public school district or Board of Cooperative Educational Services (BOCES) with students in kindergarten through twelfth grade may participate.
- Medicaid reimbursement received for health services already being provided.
- Jointly administered with Colorado Department of Education (CDE).
- Reimbursement goes to school district or BOCES to be used on health needs.
- Services Provided: Must be listed on an Individualized Education Program (IEP) or other medical plan of care. Improving health care equity, access and outcomes for the people we serve while saving Coloradans money on health care and driving value for Colorado. www.colorado.gov/hcpf

- Frequently Asked Questions:
 - Can a Private Duty Nurse bill Medicaid for services provided in a school setting?
 - After receiving authorization by the school district, health service providers may bill Medicaid directly for services provided in a school setting.
 - Are telehealth services billable through the SHS program?
 - Yes, in fact they are a valuable method of delivery for rural school districts.
 - \circ Do all school districts participate in the program?
 - No, however school districts who participate include 87% of the student population. Districts/BOCES who would like to participate should email <u>HCPF_SchoolHealthServices@state.co.us</u> or visit the program website.
 - Can private school participate in the SHS program?
 - No, only public schools can participate.
