eConsult Overview

- Colorado Medicaid eConsult launched on February 1, 2024
- Safety Net Connect (SNC) is the selected vendor partner that developed HCPF's eConsult Platform
 - > SNC also enrolls and onboards users to the Platform
- HCPFs eConsult Platform supports Single Sign On (SSO) and data integration with capable Electronic Health Records (EHRs) systems
- PCMPs have access to multiple eConsult Platforms outside of Colorado Medicaid eConsult - offering flexibility and choice



eConsult Overview Continued

Free, web-based platform: Only a web browser and internet connection are required - no software installation is needed.

What is an eConsult?

Electronic consults, or eConsults, are asynchronous (store and forward) clinical communications between a primary care medical provider (PCMP) and a specialty provider (specialist). PCMPs can use the web-based Colorado Medicaid eConsult platform to transmit secure eConsult requests to specialists.



A Health First Colorado patient comes to the clinic with medical issues that require a Specialist's advice

The PCMP logs onto the Colorado Medicaid eConsult platform and submits a clinical question A Specialist reviews the submission and closes the eConsult by providing clinical guidance

The PCMP reviews the clinical guidance and signs off on the eConsult

The PCMP schedules a follow up with the patient to go over the plan of care






Improving Access to Specialty Care


Behavioral Health Limitations

Limitations	Platform Purpose: eConsult platform is intended for PCMPs to request clinical guidance on non-urgent medical care and medication management for behavioral health inquiries directed to addiction medicine and psychiatrist specialists (currently available) which the PCMP can provide. Behavioral Health Provider Participation: Currently, Behavioral Health (BH) providers (LCSW, LPC, LMFT, LAC, Psychologists) cannot submit eConsults as treating practitioners nor can they serve as specialists.
This is not a referral tool	 Consultation is to inform treatment within the scope of practice of a provider. BH provider cannot prescribe any medical treatment but would need to refer. A medical provider would not consult with a BH provider (other than a psychiatrist or other prescriber) since they would not provide any BH treatment (therapy) other than medication.
Additional Resources	 BH Providers have access to clinical supervision or case staffings for support BH Providers should refer out for co-morbid conditions outside of their scope of practice Medical Providers can bill E/M Codes 99242-99245, 99252-99255 to consult on BH conditions Integrated Care/Team-based Care models



eConsult Submissions to Date by Month

2/1/24 - 10/31/24: 424 Total eConsults



This image displays a total of 424 eConsult submissions from the go-live date (February 1, 2024) through October 2024. The dark blue bar represents pediatric eConsults (129), while the dark purple bar represents adult eConsults (295).



eConsult Insights since Go-Live

- 91% of eConsults have been successfully resolved with recommendations for the PCMP to follow up on the next steps in care, helping to avoid a specialist visit for the Member
- 468 PCMPS are enrolled and trained to use Colorado Medicaid eConsult
- Responses from specialists are typically received in under 3 business days, with an average turnaround of less than 1 day

Steps to Participate

Providers who are interested in participating should complete the following steps below:

- Step 1: Practice emails SNC at <u>Coloradosupport@safetynetconnect.com</u> to begin enrollment process.
- Step 2: SNC sends practice enrollment and user creation forms for completion.
- Step 3: Once completed forms are returned, SNC will confirm the enrollment.
- Step 4: SNC will send training options and registration links to the practice.





Proposed eConsult Specialist to Specialist Expansion





Expansion of Submitter Role

Specialty to Specialty eConsults - 7/1/2025

Overview

Role Expansion: Current PCMP user role will be expanded to a more generalized submitter role

Purpose: This will allow Specialists to submit eConsults

Impact

Increased Access: Expand the engagement of healthcare professionals to improve access to care, support member well-being, and facilitate the co-management of members with complex, multi-specialty needs





Key Changes to the Platform

Specialty to Specialty eConsults - 7/1/2025

New Fields: Add new fields to differentiate between the types of Submitters

Key Changes to Platform

Eligibility: Specialists who are MDs/DOs, NPs/PAs will have the ability to submit eConsults as a submitter (treating practitioner user role)

Exclusions: Specialists will not have the ability to send eConsults to themselves as a consulting provider



Billing Guidelines to Policy Update

- Treating practitioner will be expanded to include eligible Specialists (MD/DO, NP/PA)
 - Specialists may submit claims for completed eConsults that they initiate to the Colorado interChange for fee-for-service reimbursement using CPT 99452
 - Specialists may utilize the Department's platform or another approved platform
- Consulting practitioner no change
- Providers may not be reimbursed for an eConsult when any of the taxonomies of the treating and consulting practitioners match



Future Considerations

Gathering Feedback:

- 1. Are there use cases we may not have thought about or identified for Behavioral Health (BH) Providers submitting eConsults to prescribers/medical providers?
- 2. Could you see BH Providers/practices utilizing the Specialty-to-Specialty feature?
- 3. Are there use cases we should consider for BH Providers requesting consultation with peers (specialty-to-specialty) that would not fall under clinical supervision or case staffing's?
- 4. How would you incorporate Specialty-to-Specialty eConsults into your daily workflow?
