1115 Waiver Requirements

Standard Terms and Conditions (STCs) pg 24:

Implementation of a requirement that providers, plans, and utilization review entities use an evidence-based, publicly available patient assessment tool, preferably endorsed by a mental health provider association to determine appropriate level of care and length of stay.

Goals:

- Improving care coordination
- Increase access to full Continuum of Care, including crisis stabilization services
- Early identification and engagement in treatment

Implementation: Targeted Date Oct 1, 2025



First Episode Psychosis Rule

First Episode Psychosis (FEP): The early period (up to five years) after the onset of psychotic symptoms due to a serious mental illness and unrelated to substance use, brain injury, or other non-SMI medical issues.

Coordinated Specialty Care (CSC) for FEP: CSC is the standard of care for treatment of FEP. It is an evidence-based, recovery-focused, team-based model that promotes access to care and shared decision-making among specialists, the person experiencing psychosis, and family members. Includes:

- Individual and/or group psychotherapy
- Family education and support
- Case management
- Medication management
- Supported employment and education services



Adult Needs and Strengths Assessment (ANSA)

Why ANSA?

- ➤ No user cost, minimal customization fees
- > Evidence-based
- ➤ Publicly available, patient assessment tool
- Reliable aid to:
 - Create Service Plan
 - Monitor outcomes
- ➤ Aligns with Child and Adolescent Needs and Strengths (CANS), currently utilized in CO-System of Care
