HOME MODIFICATION, NON-MEDICAL TRANSPORTATION, AND RESPITE (MTR)



ACUPUNCTURE, CHIROPRACTIC, AND MASSAGE THERAPY (CIH)

Options may include:

- Moving services to Community First Choice (CFC)
- Amending waivers that currently offer these services for self-directed options, or
- Adopting a 1915(j) or 1915(i) state plan option

HCPF wants to explore all available options to determine any viable self-direction authorities and identify the potential impact of implementing said authority.



- Share feedback with the PDPPC collaborative as needed

- Sketch HCPF's proposal(s) for enabling selfdirection for CIH and MRT services.
- A summary of stakeholder input to date.

Recommendations Report

- A 5-page executive summary of the full report.
- Summaries of the information gathered from the policy analysis and stakeholder feedback.
- Descriptions of federal, and state statutes, rules, and/or regulation changes needed to implement the recommendations.
- A detailed cost analysis and estimated budgets for recommendations.
- An estimated timeline to implement recommendations.
- Any CMS engagement and feedback.
- Proposed models of self-direction for CIH services, non-medical transportation, respite, and home modification services.
