<ul> <li>Appointment should occur on or after your child's 18<sup>th</sup> birthday</li> </ul>			
<ul> <li>Include your child's most recent Individualized Education Program (IEP) and any recent medical reports or documentation of child's disability</li> </ul>

#### Vocational Rehabilitation

- At the beginning of your child's last year in school or transitional learning period, work with your school as part of the IEP process to learn what transition services are available.
