

What is a Waste Walk?

- A waste walk is simply a planned visit to where work is being performed to observe what's happening and to note the waste.
- It differs from go-see activities in that you are specifically looking for waste.
- Taking a "waste walk" is one way to make the waste visible again.



What does "Waste" mean in Lean?

Performance problems can be improved by removing waste. We use a waste walk to identify waste and uncover problems.

Waste is like a "strange scent"—
it's a sign that a problem exists
in you process, even though it
may not be visible today.

- Errors producing and correcting
- Overproduction production of too much of a product, production of unwanted products
- Waiting/Pending idle time, blocked work, idle time
- Not utilizing talent the knowledge, skills, and abilities of all staff
- Transportation relocating people, equipment, supplies
- Motion movement by people
- Inventory excessive equipment, supplies, products
- Extra processing unnecessary, steps, questions, paperwork, rework


Looking for waste

- Look for Problems. Remember the Customer!
 - ► The Value for the Customer
 - Compare the output and the customer requirements. See any gaps?
 - The Flow of work
 - Are there delays due to waiting, rework, handoffs, interruptions, leaving things unfinished, etc.
 - Do excessive requirements or expectations affect the flow of work?
 - Can you find any place where there are different methods being used to accomplish the same thing?

Looking for waste

- Look for Problems.
 - ► The product of work
 - ► Is quality built in?
 - Are there standards for performance or quality?
 - Are there workarounds in place? Why? Where?
 - Are errors being produced and passed forward?
